It was a year of change in the Canadian League in 1986. The league reduced the preseason and added two games to the regular season, for an 18 game regular season. Due to the East having sent subpar teams to the playoffs over the past few seasons, the league also adopted a new playoff format. The change made it so that a fourth place team in one division could make the playoffs if they had a better record than the third place team in the other division. However, this is not like today's "crossover" provision. If a 4th place team qualified for the playoffs, they'd stay in their division, and all four playoff teams in the division would play in the semifinal round (4 at 1, 3 at 2). The two teams in the other conference would play a two game total points series, playing one game on semi final weekend, with the return match during the weekend slotted for the conference finals. The first place team had a choice of whether to host first or go on the road first (Toronto elected to go to Hamilton for the first week so they could host the second game). This format would only last one season due to Montreal not participating in the 1987 season. Other changes include kickoffs being moved from the 45 to the 35 and End Zones being reduced from 25 yards to 20 yards.

I have created this season with the help of Keith's how-to guide for Second Season football, plus the adjustments he suggests for Canadian play. If you believe I have made an error, or have a suggestion, feel free to reach out to me as well. The documentation available for past Canadian seasons isn't always as detailed as I'd like it to be, especially for depth charts for defences and O-Lines.

I have included finder charts for those who use them. I have tried to make these as accurate to the real statistics as I could, although every so often, it was difficult to be as precise as I wanted to, as teams didn't always do things that rounded nicely into 20! Sometimes I've included the names of multiple players on one die result, this needed to be done to make the percentages work out. Sometimes I had a lot of players with 1 of a particular category (usually sacks or interceptions), and adding all those players would mean reducing one of the top players' percentages, so I've included Choice as an option instead of adding 5 or 6 names to a die result. It shouldn't affect the way the top stars accumulate statistics. For this season, I have also added positions instead of individual players when it was obvious that, due to smaller rosters and the Canadian ratio, only one player per game would appear in a given position, especially at RB.

I have also added a set of Appendixes to this document, as there were quite a lot of personnel changes that weren't easy to document on the team sheets. I did my best to document as many things as a player may find interesting, but I can't promise complete accuracy, as data from this timeframe isn't exactly the easiest to find, and my source for newspaper archives currently does not have Toronto, Hamilton, or Winnipeg newspapers. The appendixes will at least point you in the right direction.



This table is based off of Keith's finder charts that he has created to simulate games quickly, which is useful for single team replays.

To use the chart, find the home team on the left, and find the visitor at the top. Roll both dice, and read them as you would for a play

If the dice roll is within the range listed, the home team wins. If the dice roll falls outside this range, the visiting team picks up the win.

If the dice roll is exactly what the last number on the win range is, the game goes into overtime.

Roll the dice again and consult the Overtime chart for the home team. If the dice roll falls within the range, the home team wins.

If the dice roll falls outside the range, the visiting team wins. If the dice roll matches the last number of the OT range, the game ends in a tie.

BC EA

Ned Armour starts the year, as Jim Sandusky recovers from a preseason injury. Sandusky returns for Game 3. Ned Armour also starts Game 14.

BC SA

John Pankratz is injured for Game 1, and Scott Lecky takes his spot. Pankratz returns in Game 2.

Harold Hallman is the starter for all but Game 18, where Dave Ponder gives him a rest before the playoffs. Hallman is back for the playoffs.

Calgary L

Stu Laird starts the season here, and John Coflin gets the start in Game 5 due to Laird being injured. Eugene Belliveau gets back into the lineup, this time at L in Game 7. Stu Laird returns to the lineup for Game 8. Dave Ponder plays here for Game 15. Laird is back again for Game 16.

Calgary F

Alvis Satele starts the season here. Brian Pillman replaced the injured Satele for Game 3. Eric Emery replaced Pillman for Game 6. Eric Emery was sent to the practice roster for game 10, and Satele slots back in. Garret Doll starts in Game 11 due to a ratio shakeup. Once Doll takes over, Mike Emery is signed to be the backup Canadian linebacker, and Emery gets the Game 18 start to rest Doll before the plyoffs. Alvis Satele starts the first playoff game.

Calgary G

Eric Emery starts the season here, with Bernie Morrison hurt. Morrison is back for Game 3.

Calgary H

Anthony Woodson starts the season, and goes out for injury in Game 14, where Alvis Satele fills in. Woodson regained his spot in Game 17 when Satele went down to injury himself.

Calgary C

Greg Peterson is the starter. Richie Hall scoots over from D to start Game 14 due to injury. Peterson is back for Game 15.

Calgary D

Kenneth Miller starts the season, but doesn't last long. Richie Hall is in place by Game 3. Hall moves over to C for Game 14 and Robert Turner plays in his place. Hall is back for Game 15.

Appendix E – Edmonton Roster

The secondary had a lot of player movement all season. This may not be entirely on point, but is the easiest way to handle things.

Edmonton A

Gary Thompson started the first 10 games. Jeff George takes over for game 11, and then Greg Harding takes over for the rest of the way.

Edmonton B

James Bell suffers a life-altering injury in Game 11, and Jeff George takes over going forward.

Edmonton C

Laurent DesLauriers is out for games 7 through 9, and then is out for the season after Game 12. Jeff Volpe stepped in as the starter for games 7 through 9, and then again from Game 13 to Game 16. Phil Jones takes over from Game 17 onwards.

Edmonton D

Cliff Toney plays the first four games, then is hurt and Mark Jackson takes over. Greg Harding plays game 10 and 11, and Toney returns for game 12 going forward.

Edmonton F & I

Stew Hill starts at F for the first five games, and Andre Pinesett starts at I. Frank Balkovec takes over at F for Game 6 and Hill moves down to I.

Edmonton H

Craig Shaffer misses Games 2 through 4, with Frank Balkovec replacing him.

Edmonton TA & GB

Hec Pothier is suspended for the season after Game 16, Leo Blanchard takes over this slot and Kurt Chapman takes over GB. Your choice if you leave Blanchard in his slot and simply put Chapman in at TA.

Edmonton EA

Stephen Jones is replaced by Waymon Aldridge for Game 6. Jones sits a meaningless Game 18, and Gizmo Williams starts.

Edmonton SB

Rick House is out for games 14 through 16, replaced by Tom Richards. House also sits out a meaningless Game 18.

Edmonton QB

Matt Dunigan starts all season except for a meaningless Game 18, where Damon Allen got the call.

Appendix H – Hamilton Roster

Hamilton QB

Ken Hobart started the first six games, but was replaced by Mike Kerrigan in Game 2 and Game 4. Kerrigan took over as the starter after this. Hobart relieved Kerrigan quite often, but Hobart's relief efforts tended to be short lived, as he seemed to be used primarily on short yardage situations after he lost the starting job.

Hamilton RB

Johnny Shepherd appears to have been the starter for the first two games. Walter Bender took over for Game 3, and besides Game 13, which Ken Zachary started, Bender had the job through Game 15. Zachary started Games 16 through 18, and then Bender was back for the playoffs.

Hamilton FB

Dave Graffi starts the season. Jed Tommy replaces him as starter after Game 4. Tommy misses Game 10, and Dan Huclack replaces him as the starter for that game.

Hamilton EA

Tony Champion starts here. When Ron Ingram is in the lineup at SB, you can swap them or leave them alone, your choice, as Ingram plays outside in this scenario and Champion plays inside, or you can opt for simplicity and leave things as is on the team sheet.

Hamilton SA

Rocky DiPietro misses the first two games. Steve Jackson starts in his place. DiPietro returns for the rest of the season.

Hamilton SB

Ron Ingram starts the first four games. Wayne Lee takes over for Game 5. Ingram is back for Game 6. Wayne Lee replaces him for the rest of the season until the second playoff game, when Ingram returns.

Hamilton EB

Steve Stapler plays every game except Game 2. Don Newman appears to get the start.

Hamilton A

Gerald Bess starts the first two games. Lance Shields takes over for Game 3. Calvin Adams gets the start in Games 5 through 8 in place of Shields. Shields returns for the rest of the season.

Hamilton E

Less Browne starts here, except Game 3, which Calvin Adams covers. Jim Rockford starts his first Canadian professional games in playoffs as well as the Grey Cup, with a 1/1 rating.

Hamilton F

Greg Gary starts the first 5 games. Frank Robinson takes over for Game 6.

Hamilton G

Ben Zambiasi misses games 11 and 12. Greg Gary replaces him for those two games.

Hamilton

Rod Skillman is the usual starter. Leon Lyszkiewicz starts the games 3 and 4. Skillman is benched for the second playoff game and the Grey Cup by David Sauve (2/2, to reflect their large comeback in the second leg of the East Final and their dominance in the Grey Cup).

Hamilton K

Mitchell Price is out for Game 5 and 6, and is replaced by Romel Andrews for Game 5 and Mark Napiorkowski for Game 6.

Hamilton L

Grover Covington misses Game 1. My guess is that Leon Lyszkiewicz takes his place, but I can't confirm that. Covington is back for Game 2. Romel Andrews plays Game 7 and 8. Covington is back for Game 9.

Hamilton Kicking/Punting

Bernie Ruoff is the kicker and punter until he suffers an injury in game 9. Dan Huclack is the emergency kicker that day, and Steve Stapler takes over the punting. Paul Osbaldiston is the kicker after Game 9, and Steve Stapler usually punts. Osbaldiston punts infrequently, but gets the job for the second leg of the East Final.

Appendix M – Montreal Roster

Montreal underwent wholesale changes throughout the 1986 season, which is not entirely unexpected for a 4-14 team that's hemorrhaging money to go through. Whether you are playing as Montreal or just facing them in a single team replay, you can either opt to simply use the listed starters and the finder charts, as the players listed as starters at the RB, SB, and EB positions all had the most touches at that slot, but if you're like me and like to go deep into the weeds, here's some help:

Let's start with the quarterbacks. Joe Barnes started week one, promptly threw 5 interceptions, 4 to the same Ottawa Rough Rider, but got the start in week two before being benched at halftime for Brian Ransom. Ransom took over the starting job in game 3 against BC after a Montreal bye week. Barnes would see a little action in relief for the next few weeks amounting to around 20 passes. The signing of Walter Lewis after Game 7 led to the release of Joe Barnes. Mark Stevens got his only extensive action in Game 8, replacing Brian Ransom after Ransom threw 5 interceptions, and was then released as Steve Calabria was signed (Calabria never threw a pass for Montreal). Lewis was pushed into the starting role for Game 9. Brian Ransom was back as the starter for Game 13, as Lewis was injured punting in game 12. Yes, you read that right. Lewis came back as a sub in Game 16 and Game 17.

The running back position was also up in the air all season. Alan Reid started week one, alongside Dan Huclack at FB. Tony Johns was out with an injury. Simply use Johns' finder chart for Huclack if you decide to go this route. This situation carried over to week 2. Huclack was dropped in a shakeup after week 2 and Johns returned. Reid was replaced after game 7 during a massive shakeup related to the signing of former USFL players that had been cut loose when the league suspended operations earlier in the month. Harry Sydney replaced Reid. Shawn Faulkner replaced Sydney in Game 12. Ricky Porter got the nod for Game 14. Faulkner got his starting job back for Game 15 because Porter suffered a knee injury after a good game against Saskatchewan.

Slot EA contains James Hood, and Slot SA contains Jacques Chapdelaine. The other two receiving slots, SB and EB, were complete disasters.

SB position had Kerry Taylor start in week one, and he was released in the same shakeup after week 7 that Barnes and Reid succumbed to. Gill Stegall (Slot EB) replaced Taylor for game 8, and then Scott Fitzkee replaced Stegall for Game 9. Ray Caissie started at SB with Fitzkee bumped out to EB for Game 11. It's less than clear, but I believe Gerald Alphin took over this spot in Game 13, and for sure had it by Game 14.

EB position was even more of a mess, with no one even coming close to having half the starts at the slot. My understanding is that Jacques Chapdelaine from box SA was the EB receiver the first two weeks while Mike McTague was the inside slot back in SA, but putting McTague at EB for the first two weeks wouldn't hurt anything and would keep things simpler. Their pass/run points both match what is in place for the EB slot on the chart, so it's completely your call how you handle this. Steve Bird is next up at the position for game 3 against BC. Bird was replaced in the Game 8 shakeup by Mike Fields for one game (who is listed in the bottom of the EA slot with an EB notation), and then Gerald Bradley took over the EB slot for Game 9. Scott Fitzkee replaced Bradley for game 11, as he was bumped out of the SB slot for Canadian Ray Caissie so Caissie could start due to the ratio and continued roster shuffling. Fitzkee was released after game 12, and Gill Stegall took his place for Game 13.

The kicking game was also in flux.

Roy Kurtz was the starting kicker week one, and kept the job until he was hurt in game 12 against Winnipeg. Rick Ryan took over as the placekicker. Veteran Zenon Andrusyshyn was picked up for Game 13 for both kicking roles.

Mike McTague punted for the first two games, but lost his punting job in the second quarter of game 2 after a block and a low average. McTague was subsequently released and signed with Saskatchewan. Roy Kurtz took over for the rest of the game, and continued both duties until his injury in game 12. Walter Lewis punted for him after the injury. Veteran Zenon Andrusyshyn was picked up for Game 13 for both kicking roles.

The offensive line was also somewhat of a mess, but I've done my best at placing the players that were considered starters on the line, and the ratings for the starters reflect how the team performed. The defense escaped most of the chaos. They had injuries here and there, but nothing all that notable. You can easily play

with simply the starters listed on the game charts and not miss much of anything. Paul Gray started the first two games at G and William Mitchell started the first two games at F before Gray went down for the season, resulting in Mitchell moving to G and Ken Ciancone starting at F I've rated all three players the same, so it's not going to make a difference whether you pay attention to this little note or not.

Lester Brown starts the season. Robert Reid took over for Game 9. Brown returns for Game 10. Reid gets the start in Game 11, and continues for the rest of the season.

Ottawa SA

Mark Barousse opens up here, and is replaced by Mike Caterbone for Game 8 due to injury. Barousse returns for Game 9. Brad Calip plays Game 11 and Game 12. Barousse is back for Game 13. Barousse also misses Game 18, replaced by Clorindo Grilli.

Ottawa SB

Stew Fraser seems to get the opening day nod, but Mike Hudson takes over for Game 2. Robert Reid (RB) gets the start for Game 5. Hudson seems to get the start in Game 6, and Clorindo Grilli gets the start in Game 7. Brad Calip starts Game 9. Grilli returns for Game 10. Mike Hudson takes over again for Game 14 and beyond.

Ottawa EB

Reggie Butts gets the call on opening day, and is replaced by Kelley Johnson for Game 9. Butts returns for Game 10, and Johnson is back for Game 11. Smith stops showing up after Game 4, and Bernard Quarles appears to become the starter going forward, except games 9 and 10, which were Paopao starts. Paopao frequently relieves Quarles, and often plays the majority of the game. Mike Kelley made a few relief appearances after Saskatchewan was eliminated from the playoffs. The only games Quarles went start to finish in were Game 5 and Game 12.
